Pursuant to your recent request to be placed on inactive status, please date, sign, and return this form to the Utah State Bar at [licensing@utahbar.org](mailto:licensing@utahbar.org). You should keep a copy for future reference.

An "inactive status" attorney pays a substantially reduced licensing fee, which enables the attorney to maintain membership in the Utah State Bar and remain in good standing. Except as provided in [Rule 14-803](#) of the Supreme Court's Rules of Professional Practice, an inactive status attorney is not permitted to engage in the practice of law. Additionally, an inactive status attorney must not mislead others about the attorney's ability to practice law. See [Rule 7.1](#) of the Utah Rules of Professional Conduct.

You should consult [Rule 14-802](#) (Authorization to Practice Law) to determine what constitutes the practice of law and what exceptions may apply in your particular circumstances. The Ethics Hotline ([EthicsHotline@utahbar.org](mailto:EthicsHotline@utahbar.org)) can also help you navigate what you can and cannot do while on inactive status.

And if you choose to reactivate your license, you should contact the MCLE Department at 801-531-9077 for information about MCLE requirements.
